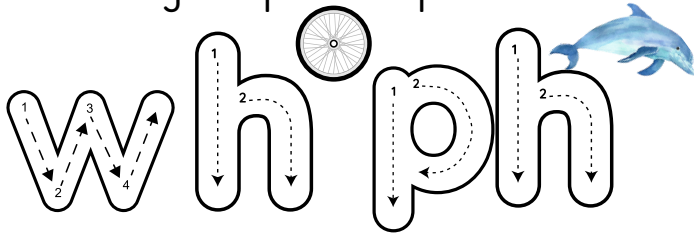
Next week, we will be learning...

LITERACY

In Phonics, we will be learning:

- 'ph' as in dolphin

MATHS

The children will be exploring subtraction.

We will be:

- Using practical objects to solve subtraction questions. For example, there are 10 children on the bouncy castle and 2 get off. How many are left?

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT



Children will recall their memories and feelings about their first days at school and notice how those feelings changed as they grew more familiar with their new environment. As they begin to prepare for their transition into Year 1, children will learn that change is a part of growing up and that they can feel safe and secure in the knowledge that God's love for them never changes.
