Hospital Visiting and Volunteering

I am really grateful for the generous response to our recent appeal at masses. Volunteering at Ashford-St Peters will require an Enhanced-DBS check, organised by the NHS Trust, so a form will have to be filled in by each parishioner who volunteers.

I made my appeal in advance of the following, which should appear in parish newsletters in our deanery.

Eucharistic Ministers: Hospital

The Pastoral and Spiritual Care Team at Ashford and St Peters Hospital Trust, have an active Eucharistic Ministry Programme that consists of Catholic Volunteers bringing the Eucharist to the Catholic patients.

Eucharistic Ministers are trained to visit and listen to patients. They provide a continuity of Sacramental care as well as an opportunity for patients to communicate unmet Spiritual needs.

Many lives have been touched by the dedication and devotion of the Eucharistic Ministers. Patients and families repeatedly share with staff how important it is to receive the Eucharist while in hospital and to share time in prayer while dealing with ill health.

We ask for Eucharistic Ministers to volunteer for a minimum of one year, to come in once a week for two or three hours to bring communion to the sick.

End of Life Visitors Training:

This is a new initiative for building an End-of-Life visiting Ministry. This will consist of meeting the needs of all patients whether they have a faith or none. There is no need for you to be a commissioned Eucharistic minister to fulfil this role. However, if the Eucharist is requested a Eucharistic minister can be provided. Full induction and training will be provided.

In Patients:

If you are aware that you or a loved ones is going into hospital. Firstly, please do request the Sacrament of the Sick from your Parish Priest (this saves calling out an On-Call Priest).

When you are admitted, please then ask a staff member to contact the R.C Chaplaincy (Elizabeth Lee) requesting a visit. We have a small team that will then visit you with the Eucharist and prayer (if you so wish) or just time to talk.

NB: We have no way of knowing you are an In-patient unless you tell us.
