

See the reminders below about Forest School sessions:

To ensure that your child is comfortable and able to fully participate, we kindly ask that they bring weather appropriate clothing to school in a named plastic bag on their Forest School days. This should include:

- Coming to school wearing PE kit on Forest School days
- Waterproofs and wellies
- Any additional layers or accessories based on the weather (hat, gloves, scarf etc.)

Part of the Forest School ethos is children having the freedom to get involved in their natural environment so they will get wet and muddy. Any brand new or precious clothing would not be suitable for Forest School as we will be outdoors for the duration of the afternoon in all weathers, unless there are severe weather warnings. It would be helpful if children could practise putting on their waterproofs and wellies independently at home. Of course, staff will be on hand to support anyone who needs help at school.
