MATHS

- Reading & writing numbers to and past 100.
- Count in 1s forwards/backwards to 100 & beyond (starting from different numbers)
- Say the number 1 & 10 more/less.
- Counting in 10s (0 100/100 0) (then starting from different numbers e.g. 7, 23)
- Counting in 2s (to 20) and 5s (to 50)
- Use number bonds and matching addition/subtraction facts up to 10, 20.
- Mentally add 2 small numbers.
- Add/subtract 1 & 2 digit numbers.
- Solve addition and subtraction word problems.
- Use vocabulary: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.
- Find and name ½ & ¼ as one of four equal parts of an object. Extend to an amount.
- Recognise/name common 2-D shapes; circles rectangles, squares, circles and triangles.
- 3-D shapes; cuboids, cubes, pyramids and spheres.
- Compare, measure & record length. Vocab: longer/shorter, taller/shorter, cm.
- Compare weight; heavier/heaviest/ lighter/lightest.
- Multiply using objects and pictures. Draw dots to create arrays to show repeated addition and multiplication e.g. 5 + 5, 2 x 5 = 10
