Subject: Marking the 80th Anniversary of VE Day - Creating Waterproof Poppies

Dear Parents/Carers,

As we approach VE Day (Victory in Europe Day) on Thursday, 8th May 2025, our school will be commemorating the significant contributions and sacrifices of all those involved in the Second World War. This year holds extra importance as it marks the 80th anniversary of the end of the war in Europe.

To visually honour this important milestone, we would love **for each child to create a waterproof poppy that can be displayed outside the school**. These poppies will serve as a powerful and respectful tribute to those who served and a vibrant symbol of our collective remembrance and celebration of peace.

We encourage your child to be creative with the materials they use, ensuring that their poppy will withstand the elements if it rains. Some ideas for waterproof materials include:

Plastic bottles or containers (cut and shaped)

Laminated paper or card

Fabric treated with a sealant

Foam sheets

Please ensure the poppy is clearly identifiable and of a reasonable size for outdoor display (approximately 10-15cm in diameter would be ideal).

We would be grateful if your child could bring their waterproof poppy to school by **Friday 2nd May**. These can be handed in to your child's class teacher. We will then arrange them in a meaningful display in the prayer garden for everyone to see in the lead-up to and on VE Day.

Thank you for your support in helping the children participate in this important act of remembrance and celebration. We believe this will be a valuable opportunity for them to learn about this pivotal moment in history and to express their gratitude.
