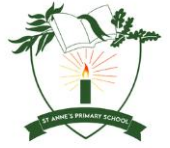

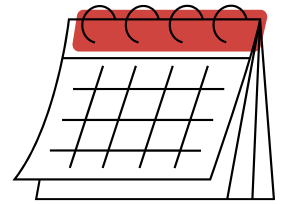

How do Ufton Court keeps children safe?

1. The main gate to the road is always locked and all visitors are required to call in and identify themselves before the gate is opened. Only the emergency services can override the entry system.
2. The house is alarmed at night should any external door be opened.
3. Some Ufton Court staff live onsite at Ufton and are 'On- Call' for every visit.
4. All staff, without exception, are subject to enhanced record checking to ensure that they are safe to work with children.
5. All guests are accompanied by a member of our staff or have proven that they have passed enhanced security checks. All staff and visitors are clearly identifiable with lanyards or Ufton branded uniform.
6. All visiting staff on site have use of radios and mobile phone so that they can communicate very quickly.
7. Ufton is situated on private land.
