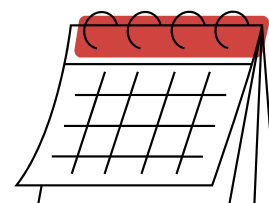

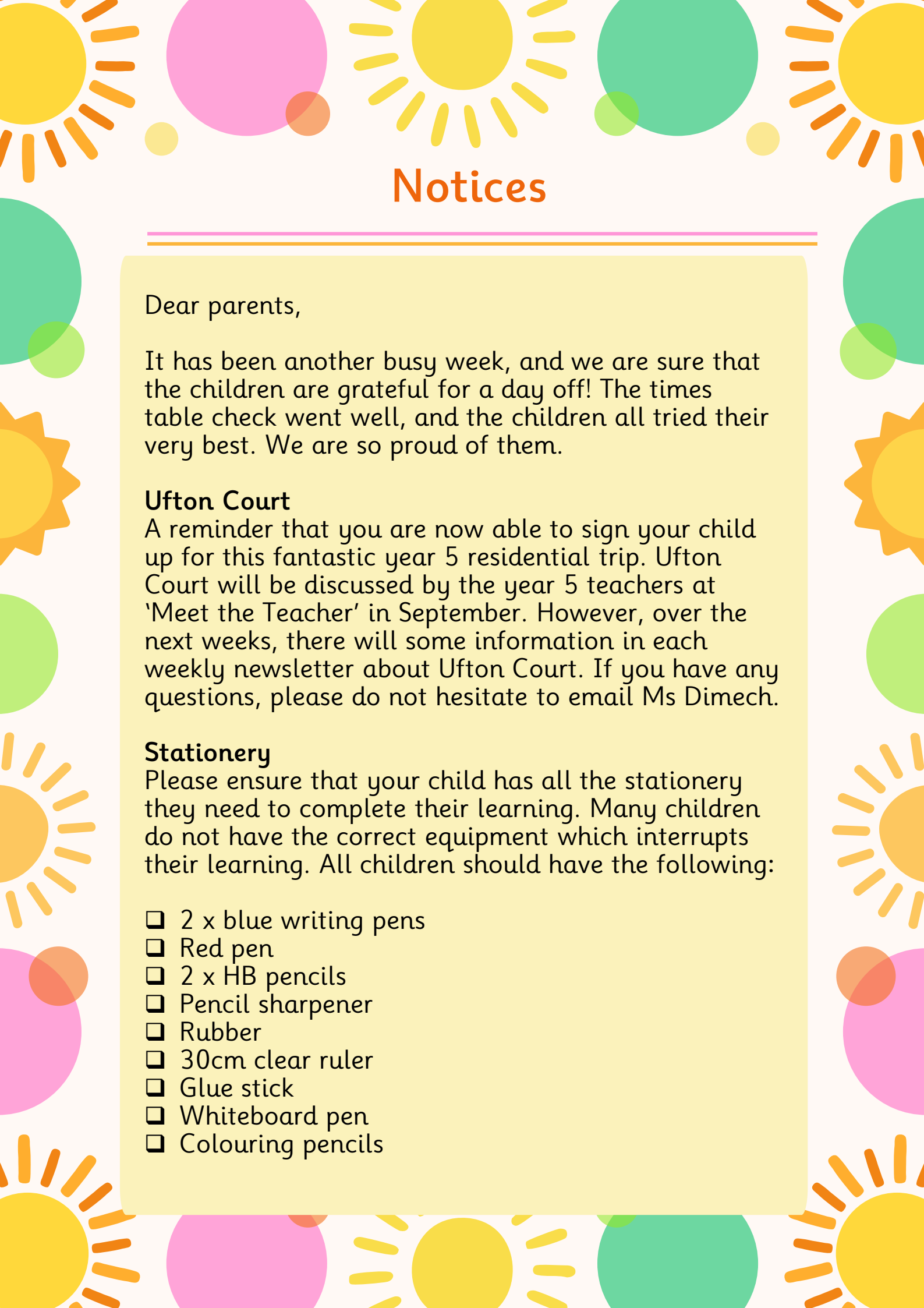

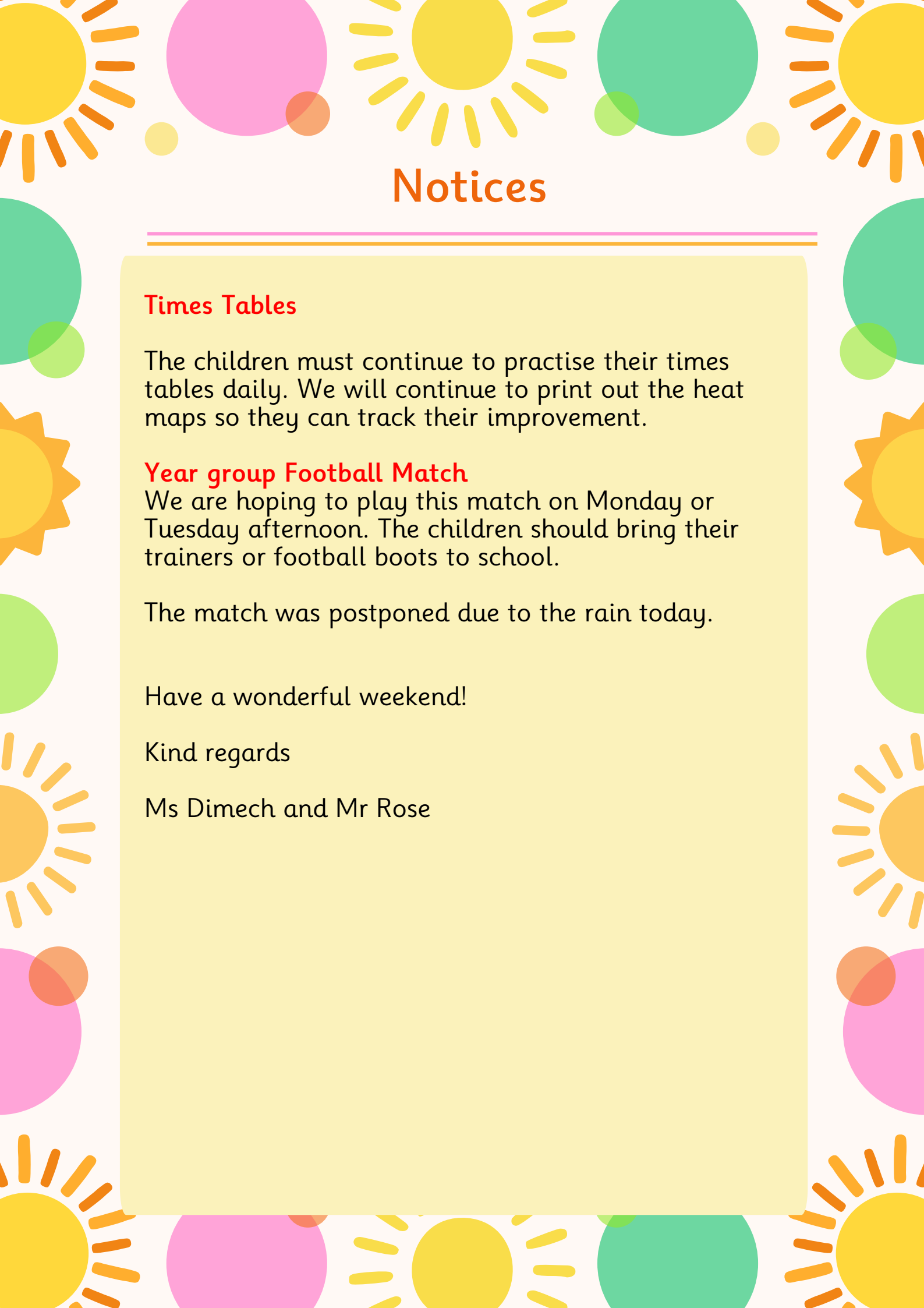

What food will be available to the children?

The meals are carefully planned and prepared fresh onsite by the resident chef, with a focus on quality, variety, and balance. Each meal is designed to offer a healthy balance of proteins, carbohydrates, fruits, and vegetables. They use fresh, seasonal ingredients whenever possible to ensure the best quality. When the menu has been finalised, I will be able to provide you with copies if you so wish.

Ufton Court know that children can have a wide range of tastes and preferences, so they offer familiar, child-friendly dishes that appeal to even the pickiest of eaters. From classic favourites like pasta and chicken burgers to more adventurous options, we aim to provide something that every child will enjoy.

In addition to meals, they also provide a range of healthy snacks throughout the day, including fresh fruit, vegetables, and home baked healthy treats to keep children energised and focused.

At Ufton, they take special care to address any dietary requirements, allergies or those with diagnosed medical conditions.

They work closely with the schools, and endeavour to meet each child's dietary needs. Whether they require gluten-free, dairy-free, vegetarian, or other specialised diets. They also make sure to communicate any necessary food adjustments with the school, allowing parents/guardians to stay informed.
