We're excited to start a new school year with you all and to live out our school values to make our community as loving as it can be.


This newsletter is a very important tool to ensure you are up to date with a range of information, so I encourage you to take the time to read it through.

The reason for including values within our school culture is because research shows when the children actively engage with values they start to understand their implications for making choices about our attitudes and responses.

A Values-based approach encourages reflective and aspirational attributes and attitudes. These can be nurtured to help people discover the very best of themselves, which enables them to be good citizens and prepare them for the life of work.

The idea is that if everyone fulfils these values our mission statement will always be lived out.

These are our priorities for this coming year. These are not new they are just our particular focuses taking into account our leadership capacity, data, staffing demographic and what the parents, pupils and staff have shared with us.

Catholic Life

We are implementing a new scheme for RE in Y6, Y1 and Reception. Plus working with our new staff members to ensure all our staff are confident in all aspects of our Catholic life.

Leadership

This year, we will have a new Chair of Governors plus a relatively fresh leadership team therefore we will be working together and with outside guidance to develop our leadership at all levels.

Teaching & Learning

Our teachers have always had individual coaches to develop the teaching but as a school we're moving to an instructional coaching model. The reason is so each teacher can have bespoke steps to meet their career stage and the particular needs of their cohort. It will take more time (not teaching time) but we feel our teachers deserve this and our pupils too.

Writing & Maths

All our work last year on reading really made a difference to our children, so this year our focus is on the writing process and plugging gaps in maths knowledge and understanding.



Inclusive Practice

We really are living out our values, as one area we are looking at this year is meeting the needs of the most vulnerable pupils and how can we be even more inclusive.

Curriculum

We have some exciting new schemes for Science, Geography, DT and Art. We started the schemes in the summer term, but we will be continuing to implement them for the rest of the year. These will enhance our curriculum, offer even more and give pupils a wider range of knowledge and skills to learn.

Over the course of the year you will be given more information of what this looks like in school and how, most importantly, it is benefitting your children's academic progress but also their well-being too.

We are aware that the pandemic has had an effect on families, but the expectation is still that every child should now be attending school full time. If you consider that there are exceptional circumstances relating to your request, please let the school have full details. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis.

Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school (absence without the agreement of the school or not covered by a medical note) and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances :-

1. Pupils identified by police and Inclusion Officers (formerly Education Welfare Officers) engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.

2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more).

- Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1st September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.
- In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body must decide whether there are exceptional circumstances. They may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised.

Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. Finally, the issuing of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance.

This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you act without delay to secure their regular attendance.

If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement in your child's attendance, please contact your child's school or the Inclusion Officer.

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School Uniform

The children all looked so smart on the first day wearing their school uniform that I think it is appropriate just to say a few words.

Wearing school uniform helps to develop the sense of community and the concept that we all belong to a special team which is, of course, the brilliant St. Anne's! So it really is important that the children wear their uniform correctly, whenever they are wearing it. The wrong message is being given if, as soon as school finishes, the wearing of school uniform becomes irrelevant and untidy. Can I remind parents that shirts/blouses must be tucked in please.

St. Anne's children are recognized wherever they go and I'd like to think this is because of their good manners and by how smart they look. Please, please do support us in this and insist that your child wears their uniform properly. It is crucial that we are <u>all</u> giving out the same message.

Just a gentle reminder that long hair must be tied back and hair accessories must be green and/or white only. Boys' hair must be short and tidy. No extreme hair cuts for boys or girls are allowed e.g. shaved head with hair on top. I would also be grateful if you could please ensure that coats are dark green, black, charcoal grey or navy.

The staff are not on duty until **8.45am**, so no children should be left in the playground before this time. Parents are only allowed to drive into school for the drop off zone in the mornings. There is no parking for parents during the rest of the school day.



Please note - cycling or scootering is not permitted on the school grounds by adults or 🗥 children.

Due to children with allergies,

dogs are not allowed on the premises past the main school gates.



Late arrivals MUST be brought to the school office to be signed in. This is primarily for safety reasons and in case of fire.

If your child is going to be absent, please ring the school and leave a message on the answerphone or send a message via Arbor. The absence must then be followed up with a written note on return to school.

Absence due to illness should be backed up with evidence from a doctor/hospital wherever possible. If a child is absent due to vomiting, they must be 48 hours clear before returning to school.

Mobile Telephones/Safeguarding

Can I remind you that the children **must not** bring mobile telephones into school unless there are exceptional reasons.

Should it be essential to have a mobile phone, the phone must then be handed in to the school office or to the class teacher in a small plastic bag and collected at the end of the school day.



Similarly if parents are on site we do ask, for safeguarding reasons, that you do not use your mobile phones on school premises.

Jewellery

Jewellery must not be worn to school with the exception of a sensible watch. Those children with pierced ears may wear a pair of small stud earrings, one stud in each ear lobe.

Earrings must be removed, for safety reasons, before PE lessons. Following County Policy, staff are not allowed to remove earrings from children's ears and pupils cannot tape them therefore they cannot take part in contact activity.

Nail varnish, wristbands, temporary tattoos and friendship bracelets should be left at home. Children with significant medical conditions may wear a med-alert wristband if wished.

Parking

Please may I remind you of some of our rules concerning car parking. It is so important that all parents and visitors abide by these for the sake of the children's safety:



- Please be thoughtful and respectful towards the residents and each other when parking on the roads
- No Parking on the pavements
- No Parking on the Yellow Zig-Zag Lines, or the Double Yellow Lines
- Please make sure you're not blocking any driveways before leaving your car





The Child and Family Health Surrey Immunisation Team is visiting your school on **Wednesday 27th September** and **Thursday 28th September 2023** to deliver Influenza (flu) vaccinations via nasal spray.

Please complete the e-consent form by 4pm on Thursday 21st September 2023 by visiting: www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk

If you do not want your child to receive a vaccine, then please fill in the 'No' box.

If you do not want your child to receive the nasal spray vaccine on the basis of porcine gelatine, please **fill in the 'No' box indicating this**, and you will be given the opportunity to consent for an alternative vaccination. This vaccination is delivered by injection into the arm (intramuscularly) and does not contain any porcine DNA agents.

An automated email will be sent to you on completion of the e-consent form from Cinnamon Digital Applications (who host the website portal for us). If you do not receive this, please check in your junk email or contact the Immunisation team.
