OUR CURRICULUM

Our well balanced and broad curriculum, based on Christian principles, ensures all children experience a sense of achievement which helps to develop their self-esteem. The close liaison amongst our dedicated and committed teachers, non-teaching staff, parent and other adult helpers ensures that the development of all children is fully supported and monitored.





Not only do we offer a broad and balanced curriculum, we also put a big emphasis on the children's well-being and happiness. The children can acknowledge their emotional state at any point during the day using our 'Zone of Regulation'. This is a whole school policy, and each child knows what each emotion means to them and how to move through the zones, if necessary, e.g. when I am feeling 'red' how can I move back to feeling 'green'. With this, we also have three trained emotional literacy support assistants (ELSAs) and a school counsellor who provides support for children one day a week. We really do believe that in order to make academic progress each child needs support and encouragement to be happy in themselves too.

Appreciating that we live in a technological world, we have an ICT Suite, laptops and iPad access to all children. All of this equipment is essential and the children tell us that they believe these help to make learning more enjoyable.

Year 5 participate in a residential trip where they enjoy life as it was in Tudor times and stay for two nights. "My favourite trip was Ufton Court, where we got to learn about the Tudors."



The children also have a variety of day visits related to various topics. Year 6 attend Henley Fort for their World War Two topic. Year 3 go to the Chiltern Museum for their Stone Age to Iron Age Topic. Many year groups also visit our local museum for lots of wonderful activities and hands-on learning.
