

You are, of course, all invited to celebrate the occasion with us and we would appreciate as many Year 3 children as possible to take part in this happy celebration.


The mass will be held at 11:30 am but if your child is taking part we ask for them to be there at 11:15 am.

Voice of the Children Updates!

The children in the group, continue to help move our school forward with their thoughts and ideas around several themes. We have been working on being more inclusive of the diverse school in which we all live and celebrating these. To that end, in the past few months, we have had the following experiences.

Several assemblies planned and delivered by pupils on themes that are important to them such as ,racism, sexism, love and homelessness. The next set that are due to be delivered are disabilities, protected characteristics, poverty and climate.

A visit from our local MP in which the group could share their thoughts and concerns about issues that affect them.

It was the ideas from this group that brought about our '80 Days Around the World' week in which every child had the opportunity to learn about the culture and traditions of other countries in the world. This was very successful and the children particularly enjoyed the opportunity to tour the school with their individual passports and learn abut other cultures.

This group have also organised and tidied up the library and support classrooms with their individual reading for pleasure areas.


I am so incredibly proud and grateful to every member of this team who help to make our school even better on a regular basis.

Attendance and Punctuality

School attendance and punctuality is very important to how successful your child can be at school. (See graphic below) You will have heard in the press that the government are looking at tackling attendance but at St Anne's we have been trying to do this for some time. On the whole the majority of parents are great at getting their children into school and on time. Some however can struggle for a variety of reasons and this cannot be overlooked.

A child is classed as persistently absent from school if they fall below 90% attendance. In a whole year 90% is 4 weeks of absence, that is a lot of learning missed, and it does equate to your child being less successful than others.



We're not saying if your child is poorly they should be in school, we're not. What we ask is that as much as possible you encourage your children into school.

We also ask that you give us enough detail to note with their absence. It is not enough to say they are poorly. We need to know what the reason is so it can be coded appropriately, we can offer appropriate support and we can answer any questions asked of us by the local authority or Ofsted.

Some of you will have received letters to say that your child's attendance has dropped below 95% or you need to offer medical evidence if your child is off sick again. Please take these letters as they are meant which is to try and prompt you to do your best, to encourage your children into school and avoid any additional absence such as family holidays.

At a recent meeting with the local authority it was commented that we had issued a number of fines to our parents. This is not done lightly, we don't receive a penny of it, but it is the only deterrent we have to avoid parents taking their children out of school. And as you may have heard in the press this is going to be going up from £60 to £80. So please bear this in mind.

Finally, we do try and do our bit to reward good and improved attendance with certificates and extra playtimes but the reality is, that at this age, it is the parents who can make the biggest difference to the children's attendance and therefore their success.
