We then had our drama group performance in the evening which was fantastic. The children performed with such confidence and should be so proud of their efforts.



PFA Easter Egg Hunt




The children will be taking part in a quiz/clue hunt within their class or year group. Once they have successfully completed the hunt they will be rewarded with a chocolate egg.



Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Absence

Reminder - if you take your children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court.


Lent Appeal


