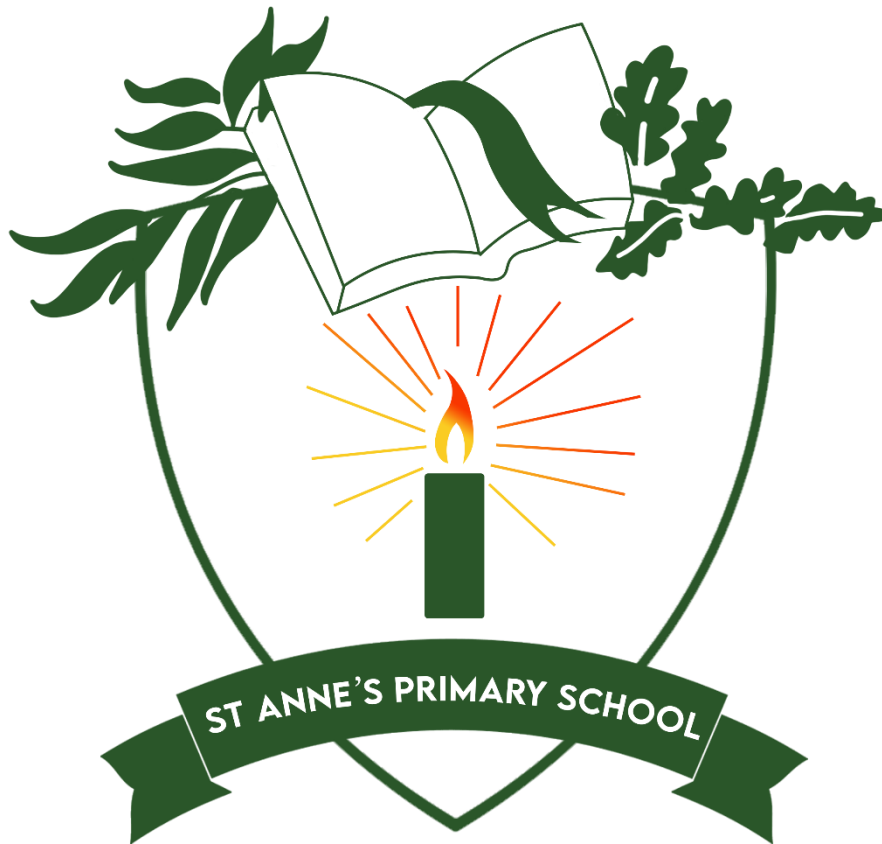


Before You Get Started Booklet

Governors Fund

Dear Parents and Carers,

St. Anne's is a great school with supportive parents, enthusiastic children, talented staff and excellent core foundations. On occasion we have to ask for your help to supplement the school budget to improve the school facilities for all children, for example, regarding resources, trips and other children's activities. Due to school budgets continually being cut, we are now compelled to look to our Governors Fund to purchase all the items and services that would have previously been paid for by what we received centrally. Therefore, we are even more reliant on our parents' generous contributions which help us to provide a rich and varied education experience.

If you can help the fund, the suggested voluntary donation, if possible, would be £50 per family per year which is slightly less than a £1 a week. However, the Governors fully accept that £50 is still a lot of money to find at once, so we ask our families if they can set up a smaller, regular payment through internet/mobile banking. Alternatively, there is an option of making your payment/s online via SCOPAY (<https://www.scopay.com/login>). Please ask at the school office if you require help with this.

Free School Meal Eligibility & Pupil Premium Application Form

Your completion of this form enables the school to check for Free School Meal Eligibility and also if additional money (Pupil Premium) can be claimed from the Government.

Free School Meals can be provided to pupils if parents/guardians meet the eligibility **CRITERIA 1** overleaf.

We urge you to complete this form even if your child does not take a school meal.

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools for pupils who have been registered as being entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years. Schools receive this funding to support their eligible pupils and narrow the attainment gap between them and their peers. Other Pupil Premiums are available to the school if parents or guardians meet **CRITERIA 2** overleaf.

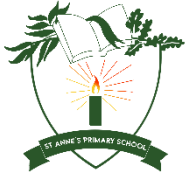

The Parent Portal and Arbor App



The Parent Portal and Arbor App are the primary communication tools used by the school to send emails and text messages.

The Parent App is the mobile version of our Parent Portal, for use on mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets. Parents can download the Parent App for free from either the Play Store for Android phones or the App Store for IOS.

Parents and Guardians have the same login and account details to the Parent App and the Parent Portal.

Arbor is used for absence, attendance as well as for signing up for school activities, updating personal details and giving consents. It is a two-way communication tool, meaning parents can send messages as well as receive them and it is entirely free to use for parents.

Online Payments to School via SCOPAY

At St. Anne's we use a secure online payment system called SCOPAY which is provided by Tucasi.

The system allows parents to view balances and is a convenient way to pay for school meals, trips, breakfast and after school clubs and much more. You are also able to link your account with any siblings in other schools that also use SCOPAY.

The system also allows the school to book a certain number of places for any 'first come first served events' and it also negates the need for reply slips as any consent required for a trip or event is made on SCOPAY easily by ticking a box.

**You will receive your unique account access letter
before your child starting in September.**

We hope you will support us in being a cashless school. Your support in using SCOPAY will help the school enormously, thank you.

How to Order Lunches

HOW TO: Order School Meals

School Dinners will need to be ordered in advance. Orders to be placed by Thursday at 12pm for the following week.

All meals, even if you do not pay for school meals (Universal Free School meals – All children in Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2), need to be ordered by the parent using SCOPAY. If your child has a packed lunch, please select code P so that we know that a school meal is not required.

Log on to SCOPAY <https://www.scopay.com/> or use the SCOPAY app.

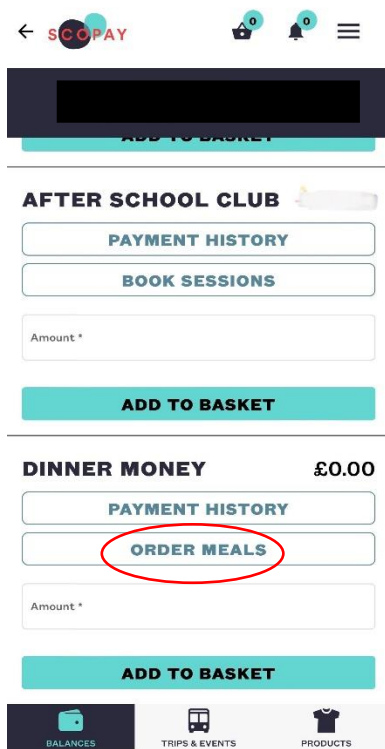

Click ORDER MEALS



This will open up the calendar for the month. If there are blank weekdays this means you have not ordered a meal for this day. Weekends, bank holidays, school holidays and Inset days will already have an **X** in the box. A **Q** in the box indicates a school trip. You may leave a date blank for any day your child will be school but will have a packed lunch.

To order a school meal click on the date, this will open a box with 4 options:

- M:** Meal and details of the this meal
- V:** Veg Meal and the details of this meal
- T:** Third Choice (only available on certain days)
- P:** Packed lunch, provided by parents

Select the choice you'd like to order and press OK.

Your choice will show up in the calendar and can be edited by clicking on the date again. To order for the following month use the arrows to navigate to the following month and beyond.

REMEMBER: You must order for the whole of the next week by the Thursday at 12pm the week before. If you have not ordered, a packed lunch will need to be provided.

Ordering in advance allows the kitchen to appropriately order food required for each option, it also means that the Learning Support Assistants in your child's class can spend more time in class supporting learning. Most importantly it allows you and your child to decide on the best meal for them each day.

If you need any help at all with placing orders, accessing SCOPAY or have any questions regarding ordering school meals the school office will be more than happy to help you.

Your child is ill or absent	Report and give reasons for absence via Arbor Parent Portal or telephone school by 9 am
The person who normally collects your child from school is changing	Telephone school no later than 2.30pm and email Class Teacher
All holidays during term time will be recorded as unauthorised. If you do wish to request an absence ...	It is however essential that you seek the school's authorisation <u>before</u> a holiday is booked. Download the absence request form from the school website or collect one from school office and return to school office
Your child is going to be late to school	Report via Arbor or telephone school office before 9.00 a.m. (most important if a school dinner needs to be ordered)
Your child has an appointment	Report via Arbor or email/ write a note to Class Teacher and collect and return child via school office
You are changing address or contact information	Modify your details on Arbor or notify school office
You are changing your emergency contact number(s)	Modify your details on Arbor or notify school office
You are moving out of the area and changing school	Write an email/letter to the Headteacher/Class Teacher
Your family domestic arrangements are changing	Speak to or write an email / letter to the HSLW

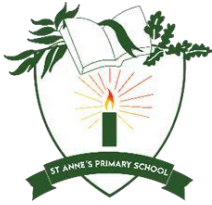
