



St Anne's Pupil Premium Planned Spend 2020-2021

Background

The Pupil Premium is a grant allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. This also includes pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure). This year, 51 children are eligible for the Pupil Premium funding grant.

Pupil Premium Planned Allocation 2020-2021

During this academic year, we anticipate using the grant of £68,595 as follows:

Oracy Support	YR	£2168	The activity's focus is to support children with communication and language and ensure they achieve their 'communication and language' (CL) early learning goal.
School Counsellor	Across the school	£5932	Provide the opportunity for vulnerable children to speak to an adult outside of school and home.
ELSA Support	Across the school	£9160	Provide children with Emotional Literacy Support in school.
School Trips	Across the school	£2500	Provides support for children to attend school trips who would not otherwise be able to do so.
Small Group Support	Y5	£7987	Provides extra English and Maths support for vulnerable pupils in Year 5 for 3 mornings per week.
Maths Online Third Space tutoring in Maths	Y6	£3759 (£537per child)	Third Space Learning (1x hour weekly)
Revision Books	Across the school	£500	Support children with materials to use outside of school.
School Clubs	Across the school	£2000	Give children experiences outside the curriculum and holiday clubs.
After School Club	Across the school	£2000	Enable vulnerable child to attend after school club sessions.
Staffing	Across the school	£2500	First Quality Teaching – support for all teachers in providing best for PP in their class.
Management of Pupil Premium Children	Across the school	£8650	Staff training, assessment analysis, monitoring, meeting parents and communication/co-ordination across the school.

Early Start Support	Across the school	£8000 CTs £4100 LSAs	Enable teachers address gaps in learning and pre-teach children for 30 mins every morning- whilst LSA cover.
Phone Calls Home	Across the school	£2000	DSLs to be in constant contact with families needing a range of support and advice.
Online Schemes of Work/ Resources	Across the school	Spelling shed - £348 TTRS - £95 MyOn/AR - £1500 Twinkl - £500	Children unable to access online schemes will be provided with workbooks and those online accessing a range of materials for learning at home.
I-pad Provision	Across the school	£9450 - £315 per unit	Enable children to access online learning from home during lockdown.
Food Vouchers – Autumn half-term	Across the school	£990	Provide food vouchers for children entitled to free school meals during half term.

For specific interventions we will use baseline data obtained from standardised assessments. At our Pupil Progress meetings we will review pupil progress to date and consider whether any further support can be targeted to help PP children reach at least 6 steps. At the end of the year we will study end of year data from assessments and Target Tracker data to ascertain which PP children reached/made expected (or better) progress and which children need further support.
